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
Detailed report of the NEST NURTURING AND EMPOWERING FOR SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION (NEST)

1. INTRODUCTION

NEST (Nurturing and Empowerment for Social Transformation) is an initiative taken by Nirmalagiri College to address the social responsibility they bear towards the betterment of a marginalized community in their neighborhood. Through NEST, the college aims to uplift and integrate this community into the socio-economic mainstream, by providing them with education, skills development and other resources necessary for a better quality of life. By taking this step, Nirmalagiri College shows its commitment to social justice and the well-being of its surrounding community.

2. THE CRUX OF THE ISSUE

The college conducted an initial survey of the community's socio-economic and demographic features which revealed that many students enrolled in regular schools were not motivated for higher education. The most common reasons for discontinuing education were identified as disinterest, detention or class repetition, difficulty in grasping subjects, social isolation, financial distress, remote location of the institution, marriage and lack of public transportation. A strategic plan was formulated under the coordination of Dr. Deepu Thomas, Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics at Nirmalagiri College to bring dropouts back into the educational mainstream. The progress of the plan is evaluated every six months by a committee chaired by the Principal and convened by the ward member and village promoter (ASHA worker). Other members of the committee include NSS program officers, two student representatives from Peruva region and the College Union Chairperson. The committee formally meets at least once every six months and as needed and all members maintain constant contact with the community.

4. TECHNOLOGICAL INFUSION AND CONNECTIVITY

Nirmalagiri College, in its effort to promote intellectual and social development, adopted the Peruva Tribal Colony in 2017 which is located in a reserve forest under the Kannavam forest range office. Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the subsequent lockdown, the college, through its teachers, conducted seminars and orientation classes to assist the tribal youth. However, a significant obstacle emerged as the students lacked access to the Internet, making it difficult for them to attend online classes during the lockdown period. With the support of Nirmalagiri College's alumni association "The Evergreen", the colony was provided with a high-speed optical fiber network which greatly helped to overcome this challenge and enhance their educational opportunities.




7. READING FOR A BETTER LIFE-BIBLIOPHILIA

Online Classes:

Since the inaugural session, online classes had been conducted every weekend for students from 1st to 10th standard. A total of 55 online sessions had been conducted from July 2021 to December 2022 through the Google Meet platform. The children had shown great enthusiasm and had actively participated in all the sessions which helped them to develop confidence and acquire a basic understanding of the English language.

Overall, the SPEAKIZY program had been a success in empowering children in remote rural areas to learn English and overcome their fear of the language. The online classes had been conducted efficiently and was well-received by the students.










9. MEET THE STARS PROGRAMME





12. NIRMAL SPARSH

One-on-one counseling services have been provided to parents and students to address academic, behavioral, cognitive, affective and developmental issues. Based on the severity of the problems students recommended by coordinators received appropriate follow-up counseling. Parental counseling and family therapy were also provided when necessary. Special counseling sessions on personal safety, hygiene, and adolescent issues were offered to middle and high school female students. Group counseling sessions were held to help students adopt a systematic study approach before exams, and a drug awareness session was conducted for men and youth in the colony. A team of counselors has been established to provide 24/7 counseling availability.

13. MISSION CHATURANJAM

Mission Chaturanjam is a long-term chess coaching program provided to students of the Peruva colony. The main aim of the program is to improve cognitive skills through chess. The program consists of three stages starting with lessons on basic openings, such as the Sicilian Defense, French Defense, and Ruy Lopez opening. Next, students receive endgame training, including queen endings, rook endings, and pawn endings. Finally, middle-game positions are analyzed. The training is conducted by students and teachers from Nirmalagiri College, who are experienced chess players and have participated in national-level tournaments. The instructors are FIDE-rated players from Nirmalagiri College, the details of which are given below.

SURVEY ON 2022

Report on Survey Conducted on December 22, 2022:

A survey was conducted on December 22, 2022 in a village with the aim of understanding the recent developments and changes in the village. The results were exciting, and some significant changes were observed.

Findings:

- Eleven villagers went to the government services in the last five years.
- The drop-out rate of school children was reduced from 25 to 10.
- Five women in the village started pickle-making units.
- Men also started their own honey unit.



Conclusion:

The results of the survey show that the village has experienced significant positive changes, especially in terms of the involvement of women in the local economy. The college's support to the villagers in selling honey on its premises has helped improve the livelihoods of the villagers. Overall, the survey highlights the need for continued support to the village to promote sustainable development and improve the quality of life for the villagers.
